RULES AND REGULATIONS

- I. Rules and Regulations for the Government of Sewerage Utilities, adopted by the Public Service Commission of West Virginia, and now in effect, and all amendments thereto and modifications thereof hereafter made by said Commission.

PHASE III

APPLICABILITY

Applicable within the entire territory served.

AVAILABILITY

Available for domestic, commercial, industrial (except for unusual industrial waste) and resale sewer service.

RATES

(I)	Service Charge	\$3.05 per customer per month
	Usage Charge	\$7.41 per 1,000 gallons of water usage

MINIMUM CHARGE

No bill will be rendered for less than \$3.05 per month.

(I) **FLAT RATE CHARGE** (customers with non-metered water supply)

1/ Each customer shall pay a minimum charge of \$36.40 per month.

2/ Unmetered, multiple occupancy - \$29.73 multiplied by the number of occupied units situated in a multiple occupancy dwelling or on a house trailer court at the beginning of any billing period. Appropriate proration of charges will occur if a particular unit is not occupied for the full billing cycle. House trailer (as used herein above) shall include both mobile and immobile units. House trailer(s), either mobile or immobile, located on sites other than a park or court, shall be billed in the same manner as any other unmetered family or business unit.

1/ Average estimated residential usage of 4,500 gallons per month x \$7.41 consumption charge plus a \$3.05 service charge.

2/ Average estimated residential usage of 4,500 gallons x .80 x \$7.41 consumption charge plus a \$3.05 service charge

PHASE III (Continued)

TAP FEE

The following charges are to be made whenever the utility installs a new tap to serve an applicant.

A tap fee of \$25.00 will be charged to customers applying for service before construction is completed adjacent to the customer's premises in connection with a certificate proceeding before the Commission. This pre-construction tap fee will be invalid after the completion of construction adjacent to the applicant's premises that is associated with a certificate proceeding.

A tap fee of \$250.00 will be charged to customers applying for service outside a certificate proceeding before the Commission for each new tap to the system.

(I) **LEAK ADJUSTMENT INCREMENT**

\$5.51 per 1,000 gallons of water is to be used when a bill reflects unusual water consumption which can be attributed to eligible leakage on the customer's side of meter. This rate shall be applied to all such consumption above the customer's historical average usage.

DISCONNECT/RECONNECT/ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

Whenever water service has been disconnected for nonpayment of sewer bills in conjunction with a water service termination agreement with the water utility a disconnection fee of \$20.00 shall be charged or in the event the delinquent sewer bill is collected by the water utility, an administrative fee of \$20.00 shall be charged.

Whenever water service, which has been previously disconnected or otherwise withheld for non-payment of a sewer bill in conjunction with a water service termination agreement with a water utility, is reconnected, a reconnection fee of \$20.00 shall be charged.
